### **Chemistry Experiments**

Students at Narre Warren North Primary School have been making all sorts of awesome chemistry experiments this term. Students have made slime and playdough and will explore how to make edible science like ice-cream and pancakes! - You used capital letters 3 times correctly in your Writing. Next time, remember that we need to use a capital letter when we use a Proper Noun like somebody's name.
- Good job!
- Excellent!
- You are using the pictures to help you work out the word. Next time, remember to get your mouth ready and say the initial sounds as well.

Giving students effective feedback is a High Impact Teaching Strategy and its purpose is to improve student learning.

At Narre Warren North Primary School, we provide students with feedback in a variety of ways. Some examples include:

- Glow and Grow during Writing tasks e.g. Glow (What am I doing well?) Grow (What do I need to do next to keep improving?)
- Two Stars and a Wish (2 things I am doing well and what I need to work on next)
- Sharing and comparing of pre and post-test Mathematics tests with the students, so they can see where they have improved or areas they still need to work on.
- Use of rubrics where the success criteria are clearly outlines and students know exactly how they performed a task.
- Peer assessment and feedback e.g. during Read to Someone. The partner can provide feedback on their partner's fluency.

When done effectively it allows students to:

- understand what they need to do to improve
- feel encouraged and supported to achieve the learning goals
- use feedback to monitor and self-regulate their learning.

Recently, the Level Teams across the school, completed a Professional Learning Communities Inquiry Cycle to improve the consistent use of punctuation in the students writing. Explicit feedback was provided to students and the consistent use of punctuation improved across the school. Students knew exactly what to do to improve and their successes were celebrated.

Here is some feedback from the students and how they felt over the journey:

**What did you learn?**

“I have to remember full stops at the end of sentences and exclamation marks after crash! And bang!”

**How did your teacher help you?**

“Explaining clearly that you can't just put an apostrophe of contraction anywhere, you have to put it in a certain spot”

**How has it improved your writing?**

“Because if i didn't use them it would be one whole big word that never ends”

**How effective is your feedback?**

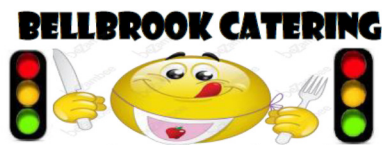

### We've been cooking up a storm in OSHC

To help you and your family stay healthy, we thought we'd share one of our most popular savoury dip from our very own Healthy Eating Cookbook.

#### Mexican Bean and Corn Dip

This quick and easy dip can be varied by adding cheese and/or diced fresh tomato on top.

It can also be served hot or cold.

##### *You'll need:*

- 2 tin of beans (use salt reduced baked beans or kidney beans)
- 1 tins corn
- 1 jar of salsa
- ½ grated cheese
- 5-6 medium cherry tomatoes diced or 1 tin of tomatoes

##### *Method:*

1. Refrigerate the cheese provided for 5 mins so that it is easier to grate.
2. Drain excess sauce off beans and corn but do not rinse.
3. Mix salsa and beans together.
4. Place grated cheese and tomato on top.
5. Serve a teaspoon of cold dip with crackers and/or vegetables.
7. Ready to eat. Enjoy!
