

# Choosing a 'just right' book

In addition to the levelled books that students take home, they are encouraged to read a wide variety of texts that interest them. As part of our CAFÉ reading program, students are taught how to choose a 'just right' book using the iPICK strategy. This strategy can also be used at home to help choose reading material!



# **1** choose a book

It is important that students have the opportunity to choose their own reading material. This helps them become independent readers.

# **P**urpose

Students should consider the reason why they want to read the book. They can do this by asking themselves questions such as:

- Am I reading for enjoyment or to learn something?
- Am I reading by myself or with someone else?
- Am I reading silently or aloud to an audience?

# <u>Interest</u>

When choosing a book, it should be something that interests the reader. There are so many fantastic books to choose from that students should look beyond reading just one author or genre. To gauge their interest, students can:

- Look at the front cover
- Flip through a few pages to look at subheadings or pictures
- Read the blurb

# Comprehension

It is important that students are able to comprehend what they read. To do this it is often useful for them to read a few pages and then stop and ask themselves:

- Do I remember what I just read?
- Did I understand what I read?
- Can I tell someone else about what I read?

# Know the words

In order for students to have a good understanding of what they read, they need to be able to decode – or read – most of the words accurately. An easy way to test this is to have students use the 'Five finger rule'. Ask them to open the book to any page and read it. The number of errors will help them determine if it is a just right book:

- 0 1 errors: the book is too easy
- 2-3 errors: the book is just right
- 4-5 errors: the book is too difficult
