Friday Bonus Play

Starting in Week 3 this term, we are introducing Friday Bonus play. Friday Bonus Play is a new initiative we are trialling as a means of rewarding those students that 'do the right thing' by following our school rules and upholding our school values in addition to providing a further opportunity for students to build positive relationships with our teachers.

Friday Bonus Play will run fortnightly, on the alternate week to assembly. During this time, all teaching staff, Ms V and I included, will run a playtime activity. Students eligible for Bonus Play will be able to choose where they wish to play during this time. Any student who has been removed from their class to the Buddy Grade more than 3 times during the fortnight due to their behaviour will not be eligible for Bonus Play and will be supervised in a classroom by a teacher while they complete a 'Re-Think' sheet. In 2019, any student removed to the Buddy Grade more than once will not participate in Bonus Play.

Grade Placement Policy

RATIONALE

Preparation of grade placement is a very lengthy process. In building the grades, teachers take into account a number of factors, such as academic ability, friendship groups, behaviour, class size, and gender. Children cannot be easily moved from one grade to another without upsetting the balance for a number of children.

PURPOSE OF THE POLICY

To explain to our school community how we manage requests for class placements, for the following school year.

GUIDELINES FOR ACTION

The process that Narre Warren North PS works through to plan each student's class placement begins months before the end of the school year. We understand that in certain situations, parents and carers may request that their child be placed with a particular friend or in a particular class.

Requests for placement with friends

Narre Warren North Primary School recognises the importance of fostering and maintaining friendship groups. We also understand that it is equally important for students to mix and learn with peers who have different interests.

We do not take general requests for children to be placed in a class with a particular friend or friends. Teachers have a good knowledge of friendship groups and will always ensure that children are placed with at least one friend for the following year.

Requests for specific class placement due to special circumstances must be made in writing, giving reasons for the request. We may not be able to accommodate these class placement requests.

Requests for placement with certain teachers

All teachers at Narre Warren North Primary School are caring and committed educators. Our school strives to ensure that all students are provided with a high quality education.

Whilst we appreciate that you may believe that your child would benefit from being placed in a class with a particular teacher, we are unable to accommodate these requests. Leadership have an in-depth understanding of each teacher's strengths and will always endeavour to place our students with teachers who are best placed to suit their needs. We do not re-allocate students to different classes during the school year, unless exceptional circumstances arise. Parents will be advised of the situation if it arises.

Requests for students to repeat a year level

Our school will follow the Department of Education and Training policy in the School Policy and Advisory Guide on Year Level Movement – see <u>Attendance</u> policy.

It is standard practice that students will be promoted to the next grade level at the conclusion of a school year. Students are only able to repeat a year level in exceptional circumstances where our school considers it is required for the long-term benefit of the student e.g. considering their social, wellbeing and academic needs. We will ensure that parents/carers are advised of the options that we consider best meet individual student needs. Decisions related to this will be made in conjunction with the Principal, Assistant Principal, classroom teacher and parents.

This policy will be reviewed annually as part of the school's three-year review cycle.
