Earlier this year I let parents know that teachers, as part of the new agreement, are allocated one day a term to improve their teaching practice. Over the last 2 months some of our teachers and integration aides visited other schools to look at best practice. Teachers from other schools have also visited our school to observe what we do extremely well. Some of our teachers visited Morewell Central PS to observe their behaviour management and 'Getting Ready for Learning' programs in order to implement similar programs, such as Friday Bonus Play, into our school. Teachers have been to Fountain Gate PS to observe teacher planning; the 3/4 Team visited Waverley PS to look at best practice in Writing and the 1/2 Team went to Mossgiel Park PS to look at their Writing program, just to name a few.

Tomorrow Australia celebrates **World Teachers' Day**. Its aim is to pay tribute to the significant contribution that teachers make to education and the development of our young people. I would like to thank our teachers for the wonderful work they do in our school and their willingness to improve their practice to ensure that our students are successful at school.

Inclusion Grant

Our school successfully applied for a Government Inclusion Grant to create an outdoor sensory area in our school for student use. We will be receiving \$59000 for this project which is very exciting!

HOMEWORK POLICY

RATIONALE

The current evidence and research shows that the quality of homework assigned is likely to be more important than the

quantity. Overall, the effectiveness of homework is enhanced by providing students with choices among homework tasks,

which will result in higher motivational and performance outcomes, students' autonomy, and intrinsic motivation (Patall

et al., 2010).

Homework helps students by:

complementing and reinforcing classroom learning

fostering good lifelong learning and study habits

providing an opportunity for students to become responsible for their own learning

developing self-regulation processes such as goal-setting, self-reflection and time management

supporting partnerships with parents by connecting families with the learning of their children.

PURPOSE OF THE POLICY

Homework provides students with opportunities to practice skills, review content and deepen understanding of concepts

learned. Homework is seen as one way of supporting and fostering life-long learning and connecting families with the

learning of their children.

Homework is recommended. There are benefits from daily reading and spelling practice. This forms the basis of our

school's homework.

GUIDELINES FOR ACTION

1. A copy of the Homework Policy will be distributed at the commencement of the school year.

2. Homework is to be purposeful, meaningful and relevant to the curriculum and needs of students.

3. Students in Grades 3-6 will use student diaries to provide a regular communication between parents and the school.

4. Students are to be given enough time to complete homework, considering home obligations and extracurricular

activities.

5. Students will be provided with support regarding their homework.

6. Homework will include a wide range of opportunities for families to engage in their children's learning, e.g. reading

to them, talking with them and involving them in learning opportunities during everyday household routines and

physical activity.

7. Students are to accept responsibility for the completion of homework tasks within set time frames.

- 8. Parents are to encourage their children to set aside a regular time and place to complete homework.
- 9. In Grades Prep to Grade 2, daily homework will include reading and spelling.
- 10. In Grades 3 and 4, homework will not exceed 20 minutes a day, this includes daily reading.
- 11. In Grades 5 and 6, homework will not exceed 30 minutes a day, this includes daily reading.
- 12. Homework will include reading (listening to reading, reading aloud, reading to your child, reading silently) and spelling (words/sounds, sight words, word sorts) on a daily basis for all grade levels.
- 13. Other types of homework may include:
 - Practising of basic maths skills, number facts and counting.
 - Real life learning at home, e.g. shopping, cooking, etc.
 - Researching for in class projects.
 - Unfinished classroom activities if required.
- 14. This policy is to be read in conjunction with DET policy and guidelines found at http://www.education.vic.gov.au/school/principals/spag/curriculum/Pages/guidelines.aspx
- 15. This policy will be reviewed as part of the school's three-year review cycle.

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

Children must be supervised at all times.


