Term 3 Wrap

With Term 3 almost coming to an end, it is a great time to reflect and celebrate all of the excitement that has been happening in Sport and Physical Education at NWNPS. We have been busy learning lots of new fundamental movement skills, movement concepts/strategies and competing in sport. This term we have had a strong emphasis on our term based theme – 'Commit to being Fit' where all year levels across the school participated in specific fitness activities this term every lesson. This ranged from shuttle runs, continuous exercise, team/individual beep tests, fitness dice, fitness cards, tabata stations, circuit training and 'So you think you can Bootcamp' activities all promoting teamwork, goal setting, motivation and encouraging others to do their best. The children really have enjoy having these goals to strive for this term and often relate back to them to see how they are progressing with their own personal fitness profiles. The effort and enthusiasm from each student has been impressive in this area of PE this year with participation rates extremely high. 
