Making Real Life Connections in 3/4

Introduction:

In Grades 3 and 4 we have been making a lot of connections to real life and we have been learning about Australia, the Royal Flying Doctor Service and rural and urban places.

Inquiry:

In Inquiry the 3's and 4's have been learning about John Flynn and how he was a big part of the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS). We also went on a virtual excursion to see inside the RFDS museum in Darwin. We found out that John Flynn started it because he found out about Jimmy Darcy, a farmer who fell off a horse and needed medical care immediately but he died shortly after.

Reading:

In Reading, we have been doing text to text connections. We have explored Australian websites, videos and books in our CAFÉ lessons.

Writing:

In Writing, we did poems which relate to Australia about Australian animals, food, places and people.

<u>ICT:</u>

In ICT, we have looked at RFDS websites and we have been on Google Maps. On Google Maps we measured the distance to different places, like from Broken Hill to Melbourne.

<u>Maths:</u>

In Maths, we learnt about rural and urban places, creating our own urban building rooftop garden. We had to work out how many pool tiles, pavers and plants we needed using number patterns, area and tessellations. This would be to show the difference between how much space rural places get and how much space urban get.

Conclusion:

These are all the things we have been doing in Term 4. We also learnt lots of things including Waltzing Matilda by Banjo Paterson who is on the 10 dollar note. Also, we learnt about first aid and practised in the art room. Yesterday there was a RFDS plane at our school. It is a simulator on the inside.



Royal Flying Doctor Service – Grades 3 and 4 Incursion

Grades 3 and 4 have been learning about the Royal Flying Doctors Service as a part of our Inquiry Unit this Term. We were lucky enough to have an incursion where they came to visit us. Tom the presenter was very impressed with how much we knew about the RFDS. Grades 3 and 4 are having a morning tea fundraiser to raise money for the RFDS.
