Return to School

Next Tuesday 9th June students in Grades 3 to 6 will be coming back to school. They will need to return their chromebooks to school on this day. Teachers will be checking these as they are returned to ensure that they are in good condition as per the agreement parents signed.

Next week Grade Prep to 2 students will continue to come into school via the front gate as they have done for the last 2 weeks. They will go directly to their grades. Siblings in Grades 3 to 6 can come in with them.

Other Grade 3 to 6 children are to come through the gate next to the kinder and the gate near the Grade 3 classrooms. A teacher will be on duty at each gate to direct the students. All children are to go directly to their classrooms. There will be no playing in the yard.

Drop off times will be between 8.50am and 9.10am for all students. Gates will be locked after this time. Late children will be required to come through the office.

Students will be dismissed by their teacher at the same gate they entered for Grades Prep to 2. Grade 3 to 6 students will be dismissed from the classroom but will be asked to leave via the gate they entered in the morning. Please make sure that your Grade 3 to 6 child knows where you will be waiting outside the grounds.

Grade Prep pick up time will be 3.15pm; Grades 1/2 at 3.20pm and Grades 3 to 6 will be at 3.30pm for next week to see how it goes. If parents wish to pick up a child in both the Junior School and Senior School at the same time, pick up time will be at 3.30pm and the younger child will go to the older sibling's classroom. They will leave via the main gate near the crossing. You must notify the classroom teacher in the morning if you require your younger child to stay with their sibling so this can be arranged. Grade 3-6 students will not be allowed to leave before 3.30pm.

Camp Australia will be open before school and is currently a free service. You will need to register online for this service.

A reminder to please also keep the path to the crossing free so students have easy access to the crossing. Please be on time.

If you wish to pick up your children earlier than your allocated time you must <u>call</u> the office beforehand. The front door will be locked. No <u>extra</u> pickups will be between 2.45pm and 3.30pm.

Break times will continue to be staggered during the day so that the children can keep their social distancing while outside. Children will play in designated areas. Hand sanitiser will be available in all classrooms.

READING

Make the time spent reading at home fun and enjoyable. Remember to be patient!

Give your child time to work out the words. 5 seconds or more is reasonable. After 10 seconds, encourage your child to use the following strategies:

*What do you think the word is?

*Read the sentence again to see if you can work it out.

*Have a go

*Look at the picture

*What does it start with?

SOME THINGS TO TRY:

- Encourage your child to guess what the story is about before and during reading by looking at the pictures, cover and title.
- Praise when an idea or word is used that makes sense in the context of the story.
- 3. Ask questions like "Why did the boy do that?"
- 4. Talk about the pictures so your child gets an idea of what they may be going to read about.
- Don't just tell them the word! Suggest a strategy so that they can learn to read the words independently.

CORRECTING MISTAKES

If the mistake makes sense, such as 'house' for 'home', let your child continue until the end of the sentence or page and then ask "What word was that?" "You said 'house' and it doesn't have an 's' in it." If the mistake does not make sense, lead your child to correct the mistake by allowing time to self-correct. If they do not self-correct, at the end of the sentence, re-read what they have said and ask "Does that make sense?" Finally, if the meaning is still not clear, look at the word and find familiar sounds such as 's' at the beginning or 'ing' at the end.

MORE TIPS

Beginning readers may want you to read the book or page first. Take turns to read parts or pages of the story. Try leaving out the last word in some of the sentences, so your child can guess what the word could be. Talk about the book after reading. Make it FUN! () ** If your child sees you reading every day, this will help develop a lifelong love of reading in your child too.

AFTER READING DISCUSSION and QUESTIONS

When finished reading, ask your child plenty of questions.

- *Did you enjoy the book?
- *Which character did you like best and why?
- *Why did that character do or say that?
