Chaplain survey

I would like to thank the 238 people who completed the Chaplaincy survey over the last 2 weeks. I was overwhelmed and excited with the number of responses to this survey.

The information below comes from the survey:

99.6% support the need for continuing the chaplaincy program and agree that pastoral care/student emotional wellbeing are key needs of our school.

- 97.9% are comfortable with accessing the service.
- 33% of responses (78 families) have used the program.

The comments were also invaluable as I was able to use these within the application to support the need to have a Chaplaincy Program.

The number of survey responses/positive comments indicates that this service is an essential need for our school. Hopefully not, but if we are unsuccessful (we have had the funding for 10 years) I will be asking School Council for approval to self-fund the program.

Next week - return to school:

Term 4 staggered drop offs and pick ups

Mornings:

No staggered starts. Children make their own way to the classroom.

All gates will be open from 8.45am to 9.05am. Gates B and C will be locked then. After 9.05am access will be via Gate A only for latecomers.

There will be a 'Stop, Drop and Go' at the entrance of the staff car park (from A'Beckett Rd direction) and Winter's Lane (in front of tennis court in parking area going towards Marcos). A staff member will be at these gates wearing a fluoro vest. Parents please do not park in the car park in the front of the school before 8.45am. If you do, for safety reasons, you will have to remain in your car until all students have entered the gates.

Afternoons:

Staggered pick up times. Parents are required to leave before the next group of students are dismissed from the school grounds.

Students leaving will be via surnames at the following times through their correct gate as listed above:

2.45pm: A - G 3.00pm: H - M 3.15pm: N - T 3.30pm: U – Z

Children who walk home or ride their bikes will be dismissed at 3.30pm. Children who go to After School Care will also be dismissed at 3.30pm.

Please note: Interval times may be shortened, or there may be changes for the following week- times to be confirmed.

2020 Parent Opinion Survey
