Statement of Philosophy

At Narre Warren North Primary School we believe that all children have the ability to learn. By providing all school environments (this includes onsite, online activities and offsite for excursions, camps, etc. and outside of school activities) that are stimulating, safe, happy and positive, we foster the learning potential of our children. We will develop a high standard of literacy and numeracy, by encouraging inquiring minds and effective communication skills. Our students will be encouraged and challenged to fulfil their academic potential, develop self discipline, self esteem and become independent learners.

As a school community we actively promote the safety and wellbeing of students, with all staff committed to providing a child safe environment, recognising and inclusive of the needs of all children, particularly students who are vulnerable due to age, family circumstances, abilities, medical condition, or indigenous, cultural or linguistic background. In accordance with our legal obligations, including child safe standards, we are committed to protecting students from abuse or harm in the school environment.

Our school's vision is to prepare young people to become active, engaged and responsible citizens of the local and global community. It aims to prepare students to live in a dynamic 21st century in which creativity, cooperative work, connectedness to the world and adaptability are key features.

Students have opportunities to practise their social and emotional learning in safe classroom environments, where we have created a culture of celebrating mistakes and demonstrating Growth Mindset across all areas of the curriculum.

At Narre Warren North Primary School we enact this vision by giving our students a grounding in the '4 Pillars of Learning' needed to be successful in life:

Learning to Know - being literate and numerate and being able to expand knowledge to understand the world and act effectively in that world.

Learning to Do/Apply - being able to use ICT effectively and to build knowledge of digital literacies, being able to put into practice the necessary skills learned in all curriculum areas to everyday life and developing qualities such as communication, teambuilding and problem solving skills.

Learning to Live Together - celebrating and valuing diversity; showing mutual respect, empathy and concern for others and the world we live in through the development of social skills and restorative practices.

Learning to Be - living the important values in life including our school values to assist students in having the personal resources and intellectual tools needed to understand the world and behave as fair-minded, responsible human beings.

The school values Respect, Responsibility, Resilience, Persistence and Honesty at Narre Warren North Primary School. Our aim is for all children to reach their full potential and take responsibility for their own learning.
